#### UPDATE ON MRA WEBSITE AND OTHER SOCIAL MEDIA

The MRA website continues to be updated, as needed. Contributors to the proposed Memorial are added to the lists, with permission. Background information for former and current MSFC personnel in the Memorial Database is added, when submitted by self, family, friends, and colleagues. The database contains approximately 21,700 names, after the addition of the names of new employees in 2020-21.

The website is more user friendly now that all the fields in the database are searched for the search text entered. A user can search for a name by Last Name or First Name/Last Name or one can search for content not related to the names, such as "propulsion," which will find all database entries with "propulsion" in the biographical or other information. To enrich the database content, we continue to solicit submission of background data. Also, any errors or needed corrections found may be submitted through the edit feature in the database section of the website, by submitting a Question through the website feature, or by direct contact with Gray Settle at marshallspaceexplorers@gmail.com.

We are currently investigating an additional website capability to include submitted "stories." #### SPACE EXPLORATION MEMORIAL (UPDATE) By Rick Chappell

The Space Exploration Memorial activities are continuing on several fronts. An important one of those is the work on the database which Gray Settle and Annette Tingle are leading with support from the Memorial committee. As the biographical information is added, the database is being optimized to capture the history.

Gray's article in this newsletter goes into more detail on this approach in addition to the new social media website, Facebook pages, and GoFundMe online links. With the social media, we are working to expand the community outreach of the MRA to include the broader group of space explorers who have worked in the Huntsville area and encourage their involvement and support for the memorial activities. As an example of this outreach, I wrote about space exploration over the decades in Huntsville, which will be published in the Old Huntsville Magazine. A short version will be on the back of the magazine and will be used for a flyer that, in conjunction with our brochure, will give more insights into our goals.

Funding for the memorial is increasing steadily with the majority coming from individuals both connected with NASA and with contractors, **together with a significant agreement of support (\$50,000) from the Madison County Commission.**

She has been Secretary to the MRA Board for a number of years and keeps the members informed of activities/events. Bennie was a main player on the 50<sup>th</sup> Moon Landing Anniversary Celebration Committee and oversaw the production of the 38 lectures and panel discussions associated with the celebration. Space does not allow us to name the many local organizations that benefit from her volunteerism.
