# **SPACE EXPLORATION WALL OF HONOR**



While the Space Exploration Wall of Honor has been a vision in our minds for a long time, it is now a REALITY! The concrete structure, the pavers and landscaping have been completed.

The panels containing the names of 21,500 employees at Marshall are being made. Panels 1 and 21 are mounted. Panels 2 thru 17 are being manufactured. Completion date for all panels is the end of February 2025.

MRA has raised \$1,006,000 to fund the Wall. <u>A huge thank you to Dr. Rick</u> <u>Chappell for his vision of the project and his untiring efforts to raise funds to bring</u> <u>it to fruition</u>. As you approach the Wall of Honor at the Rocket Park within USSRC, you will be greeted by the **kiosk** in the Park. The kiosk has great capacity to capture the picture and career information of each individual on the Wall, if that person has entered the information. Previous newsletters encouraged each of you to go to the MRA website: <u>www.marshallretirees.org</u> and provide your information in the database. Gray Settle is leading the finalization of the software and names which can now be accessed at the kiosk. When you enter the name of a NASA friend or family member, the kiosk shows you a brief sketch of the time period of their NASA career and the panel number and row number where their name will be located.

The primary purpose of the Wall of Honor is to recognize the contributions made by ALL of the individuals who worked at Marshall. Each contribution has been important in achieving America's goals in space.

## JACK STOKES RECEIVES NATIONAL SPACE CLUB'S JACK LEE SERVICE AWARD



MRA member Jack Stokes received the Jack Lee Community Service Award at the Von Braun Dinner on October 20<sup>th</sup>. Jack's career as a Human Factors Engineer at MSFC involved work on the Lunar Rover, Skylab, International Space Station, Tektite II undersea laboratory and Constellation Program.

Having developed a MSFC human factors design standard set, he served as the colead for the NASA-level Human Factors Integration Standards.

As a retiree, he is involved in local outreach programs, such as First Stop, Wheels for Working, CASA, Habitat for Humanity, and served as his church's Outreach Chairman for 20+ years.

Jack is an active member of the USSRC's Emeritus Docent volunteering many hours by giving first hand experiences to visitors and serves as a judge for the Alabama Science & Engineering Fair. He is currently leading the effort of conducting oral history recordings of MSFC personnel through the University of Alabama-Huntsville. He also played a major role in the events surrounding 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Lunar Landing. He presently serves as a Board Member of the Marshall Retirees Association. And, we might add, he is a vintage car enthusiast.
